## United States Reactions After the Raising of the Berlin Wall

This decision avoided transforming the Cold War into a Hot War, but it also manifested the separation of East and West Germany and made the unification in the near future less likely. The decision helped to establish another socialist state in Europe and locked up 17 million Germans within the borders of East Germany. Did they fear the military strength and the use of the Soviet nuclear arsenal Or did they...
